

### Export history

Identifies items that were previously exported.

- The green icon is used for **unedited** items.
- The orange icon is used for **edited** items (i.e. containing photos that have been edited).

### Items selected for export

- To select individual items, check the corresponding boxes.
- Alternatively, you can use the "Selection" menu to make bulk selections.
- Based on your preferences ("iPhoto To Disk | Preferences" menu), iPhoto To Disk can automatically select items when it starts.

### Export options

- **Folder hierarchy** - For **albums**, iPhoto to Disk uses the folder structure defined in iPhoto. For **events** 6 options are available as shown in the following examples: *Paris, 2008-05-24 Paris, 2008/Paris, 2008/2008-05-24 Paris, 2008/05-May/Paris, 2008/05-May/2008-05-24 Paris*
- **Filename** - You can keep the original file names, name your media files after event/album names or use the titles you have eventually defined in iPhoto.
- **Media filter** - This is where you decide if you export photos only, movies only, or both.
- **Scope filter** - For an edited photo, iPhoto stores 2 versions of the photo in its library: the **original** (not edited) and the **current** version (edited). With the scope filter, you can decide if you want to export the current version only, the original version only, or both.
- **Conversion** - You can include iPhoto metadata in your JPEG/TIFF photos and/or convert your photos to JPEG, TIFF or PNG.
